- 3. read and comprehend basic information and simplified texts;
- 4. write simple sentences in the present tense in Spanish;
- 5. understand very common and basic grammatical structures;
- 6. gain familiarity with Spanish-speaking cultures.

Teaching and Learning Approach

A functional-communicative approach is used. Course activities provide learners with the opportunity to:

- become familiar with the Spanish sounds and syllabification
- · recognize personal pronouns, regular and irregular verbs
- understand the gender of nouns and adjectives
- read and discuss short stories
- comprehend simple conversations
- memorize words and short sentences
- become familiar with idiomatic and cultural expressions
